Spring 2 What happens when I fall asleep?

Please find below the homework expectations for this half term. All children are expected to complete the non-negotiable, weekly tasks. They are also expected to choose a minimum of three tasks to complete and document throughout the half term (The non-negotiable tasks can be documented in their 'Me and My World' book). Each task is closely linked to the work that we are doing in class and is due in on **Monday 30th March**. The children will have the opportunity to present their work to their class during this last week of term. Please include any other achievements or activities as we would love to share these celebrations and successes with your child.

Non-negotiable Weekly Tasks			
Read to an adult five times a week. (Adult to record this in the reading record book)	Complete your 'Me and My World' book every week and return to school on Monday morning. Use pictures, drawings and captions to show us what you what been doing over the weekend. Ask an adult to write a couple of sentences about what you have been doing and see if you can copy it.	Learn your set of red words (in homework books). Can you read them in story books?	Practise writing the letters of the alphabet and numbers 0-20.
Choose a minimum of 3 homework tasks to complete and hand in on Monday 30 th March.			
Colour in the activities you do and ask an adult to sign in the box. Please record these activities in your homework book. This can be written evidence or photos.			
Make your own Sleep Diary . Make a note about what time you go to bed, what time you wake up and how many hours sleep you get each night. You will share these diaries with your class on the last week of term.	Use a telescope or binoculars to look at the night sky. What can you see? Draw a picture or write a sentence, describing what you can see.	Make a poster to teach someone how to brush their teeth properly. Photos and writing can be included.	
What is your favourite bedtime story? Tell me about why you like it. Bring it in to read with your friends during the last week of term.	Make your own spaceship and alien. What materials did you need to use to make your spaceship?	Plan a tea party on the moon for the aliens. You could draw pictures of the food you want at the party. Think about what kind of food an alien might like - star biscuits, rocket jelly or moon cheese balls, the possibilities are endless!
